Program Areas

Health Care

The WI Division provides customized health and safety training for employers in the college's seven-county service area in addition to health care courses for the general public. Courses include but are not limited to topics such as: Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), Phlebotomy, Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), Advanced EMT, Electronic Medical Records, CPR/First Aid, Medical Coding, Blood-borne Pathogens, and American Heart Association Training.

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Industrial – Quality, Maintenance, LEAN, Etc.

The WI Division provides customized training programs in areas such as quality improvement, LEAN, and industrial maintenance for manufacturing and industrial employers in the college's seven-county service area in addition to quality improvement and LEAN courses for the general public. Courses include but are not limited to topics such as: LEAN Training, ASQ Training, Statistical Process Control, GD&T, PLC, Robotics, Six Sigma, ISO Training, Arc Flash Safety, Cranes & Hoists, HAZMAT, HAZWOPER, HVAC, OSHA, Wastewater and Weatherization.

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Professional Development

The WI Division provides professional development training for employers as well as the general public in the college's seven-county service area. Courses include but are not limited to topics such as: Supervisory Leadership, Customer Service, Communication, Management, SHRM Training, Professionalism, Computer Courses, and Occupational Spanish.

Transportation and Logistics

The WI Division provides many transportation and logistics course options in the college's seven-county service area including Forklift Driver Training, CDL Training, Customized Logistics Courses, Motorcycle Safety, and Defensive Driving. CDL options include Class A CDL, Class B CDL, refresher courses, and endorsements including School Bus, Passenger, and HAZMAT.

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Personal Enrichment

The WI Division provides a host of different courses that are designed for the personal enrichment of residents in the college's seven county service area, but are not necessarily linked to employment opportunities.
